## Japan Sports Agency (JSA) – November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020 : Meeting with the Commissioner of JSA, Dr. Koji MUROFUSHI

November 30<sup>th</sup> 2020, TIAS program visited the **Commissioner of the Japan Sports Agency Dr. Koji MUROFUSHI** (<a href="https://www.mext.go.jp/sports/en/about\_us/choukan/index.htm">https://www.mext.go.jp/sports/en/about\_us/choukan/index.htm</a>) in Tokyo, led by Prof. Hisashi Sanada (along with Prof. Randeep Rakwal, Researcher Dr. Takuya Tsukamoto, and Administrative Staff. Mr. Tetsuhiro Sugaya) to request the presence and a 'key address/speech' by the JSA commissioner for the up-coming Sport for Tomorrow Academy Legacy Project Showcase Conference entitled: International Academy Conference -Achievements, Legacy and Continuity 2020-, and update about the TIAS program and continuity via the TIAS 2.0 degree program at University of Tsukuba.



The meeting lasting around 45 minutes, well over the appointed time where graciously Dr. MUROFUSHI interacted with us, exchanging views on the value of Olympic movement, Olympic history and the Olympic spirit and the era of Jigoro Kano sensei and the linkages between ancient to modern Olympics, and the meanings therein from physical to mental to community influences, and sport for life.
