IIS (JSW Sports, India) Judokas Training in Japan: A Report on International Cooperation through JUDO at University of Tsukuba-TAIIKU-and TIAS Legacy

Following the signing of an LOI between University of Tsukuba (UT)-Faculty of Health and Sport Sciences and the Inspire Institute of Sport (IIS; as part of the JSW Group-led not-for-profit

initiative in SPORT) two (2) Women Judokas from IIS (India) travelled to Japan (Tsukuba) for training-practice from September 4th to 19th, 2019, in a first such initiative.

Coach Mamuka was more than happy to see his Judokas train well and thanks greatly Okada sensei and the Judo Team at UT for this excellent opportunity and to welcoming them at their Judo Hall. Further Coach Okada invited these 2 young Judokas to a training session at Shukutoku University (Judo-bu) for an all Womens' Judokas training, which was a great opportunity to interact with so many women Judokas and also their coaches (including Coach Nose Eigo - All Japan Judo Federation-Women Junior National Team; and Coaches Keisuke Miyake-Chukyo University and Takeru Sato-Kogakkan University). Coaches Okada and others were greatly impressed by these 2 Judokas, and remarked that they see a great hope and future for them being champions, in the coming years with this kind of progress and energy; and would like to welcome them again for training in Japan.




